BSO Report:

The status report of projects the IBC Management Team (IBCM, which consists of the BSO's and the Chair and Vice Chair, along with the Administrator, Nancy Wrigley) has reviewed in the last two quarters. Brynte asked if anyone wanted to review any of the applications they could, and should contact Nancy.

Incidents and Accidents:

There was an incident last fall with some shipping of SA's offsite. The CDC suspended our permit for working with SA's. LLNL stopped all work with SA's until the CDC could come back and inspect us, which happened August 2005. They came back again in February 2006 for a re-review; at the same time the DOT was here.

The DOT found this situation had some unusual circumstances and they were to issue a "Warning Letter", the minimum finding it can issue for a violation, but as of now no fine is forthcoming.

After the CDC's re-review they renewed our SA certificate/permit until 2009.

The status on B368: Vapor Hydrogen Peroxide (VHP) system can't seem to get to work correctly. The HVAC does not work properly with it. We need to have 3-4 good runs before we can get final approval of the building. Then an independent review team will need to inspect it (Bob Hull), and then the Laboratory Site Office (LSO) for DOE can give us the final approval.

Other:

At the next Quarterly meeting Kathleen Noonan wants to discuss the SA, Human Reliability Program, which is an offshoot of the nuclear HRP, but involves those in the Select Agent (SA) program who have unencumbered access to SA's.

Kathleen Noonan also wanted to let everyone know that when the Hepatitis B vaccination is offered anyone in health services can assist them. Dr. Perieira is not the only one that can do this. Immunization is always offered but not required
